- 1. Where the Ashley, Cooper, and Wando meet You sometimes see dolphins although discrete Answer: Charleston Harbor – Harbor Overlook
- 2. My cousin the shark is cartilaginous like me You can find me *outside*, right next to the sea Answer: Cownose or Southern Stingray – The Shallows***
- My body is blue, a black crown on my head Got a saintly royal name, algae is what I am fed Answer: Queen Angelfish – Carolina Seas
- As a shade-tolerant evergreen tree,
 I provide shelter with branches and leafy debris
 Answer: Eastern Hemlock Mountain Forest
- You see me on quarters, in the sky or a tree No longer endangered, soaring in the land of the free Answer: Liberty, Bald Eagle – Mountain Forest
- My fur is dense and I have big webbed-feet You won't find me in the ocean, freshwater is where I eat Answer: River Otter – Mountain Forest
- Thought to be extinct due to habitat loss, Rediscovered in Georgia, cause assumptions were false Answer: Robust Redhorse – Piedmont (Piedmont River)
- I am a long slender fish with a sword-like snout
 I prefer freshwater, when I swim about
 Answer: Longnose Gar Piedmont (Reservoir)
- In this habitat, water can look mucky, But it is really leaf tannins, which make it look yucky Answer: Coastal Plains (Blackwater Swamp)



- Without camouflage, it is tough to hunt and hide The Aquarium is my home, so I won't sunburn outside Answer: Alabaster, American Alligator – Coastal Plain (Blackwater Swamp)
- Water I grow in takes nutrients I need, I capture bugs in pitchers and grow from a seed Answer: Pitcher Plant – Coastal Plain (Carolina Bay)
- 12. My broad front legs help shelter construction, Now I am endangered due to habitat destruction Answer: Gopher Tortoise – Coastal Plain (Longleaf Pine Forest)
- 13. I like to use my rattle to distract and protect, And when I feel threatened, my venom I inject Answer: Eastern Diamondback Rattlesnake – Coastal Plain (Longleaf Pine Forest)
- 14. I have a curved red bill, I use to search for prey White wings and body help me fly over the bay *Answer: White Ibis – Saltmarsh Aviary****
- 15. My oversized bill helps me scoop up fish The ban of DDT helped my species flourish Answer: Eastern Brown Pelican – Saltmarsh Aviary
- 16. Diamond-shaped scutes line the top of my shell My strong webbed-feet help me swim and propel Answer: Diamondback Terrapin – Saltmarsh Aviary
- 17. I am plentiful of plants and change with the tide I have brackish water for animals to reside Answer: Saltmarsh Aviary
- I have five rigid arms with eyes on each end
 I can be found in a tide pool where I blend
 Answer: Common Sea Star Coast (Touch Tank)



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- Got a long "horsy" snout, armor to protect Only males have babies and I swim erect Answer: Lined Seahorse – Coast (Seahorse)
- I am a venomous fish, with red and gold stripes Invasive to our water, I can be eaten fried or diced Answer: Lionfish – Coast (Aquatic Invaders)
- 21. I am a transparent invert, plankton is what I eat For protection I have stinging cells that I excrete Answer: Moon Jelly – Ocean
- 22. As a microscopic organism floating in the sea The marine food web would be broken without me Answer: Phytoplankton – Ocean
- 23. I am the state reptile with a log-like head Ectothermic and my shell is brownish red Answer: Caretta, Loggerhead Sea Turtle – Great Ocean Tank
- 24. My body is covered in spines lying flat I puff when I am scared to look big and fat Answer: Porcupine Puffer – Great Ocean Tank

- 25. You might see me dwelling on the ocean floor I can breathe without moving if I don't want to explore Answer: Nurse Shark – Great Ocean Tank
- 26. With very sharp teeth and gift of speed I am an opportunistic predator when I feed Answer: Barracuda – Great Ocean Tank
- 27. I am a nocturnal animal, I like to show my teeth Even though I look green, I am brown underneath (yellow mucus)
 Answer: Green Moray Eel – Great Ocean Tank***
- 28. I am the largest hard-shelled sea turtle around The only herbivore sea turtle to be found Answer: Green Sea Turtle – Zucker Family Sea Turtle Recovery
- 29. The most endangered turtle in the sea I am the smallest sea turtle Carolinians see Answer: Kemp's ridley Sea Turtle – Zucker Family Sea Turtle Recovery
- 30. We hitch a ride on turtles for food If the turtle needs care, we can be a clue Answer: Barnacles – Zucker Family Sea Turtle Recovery
