GOT News

- Safety Divers be on you're A game.

Caretta is getting more active and a bit teethy at times.

o Recall it's ideal to be in a place where all divers are in front of you within a head turn (more or less)

Midwater **10-15ft**, back of the tank is a good starting spot, till you notice something that requires attention or relocating

- o Remember to have a general idea of where our key animals are in relation to other divers
- Class for Exhibit Surface Supply Diving is coming soon.
 - o Try to get more GOT Guardian dives in if you're not fully comfortable
- Fish ID Quiz is coming up soon. It won't be open book like the others, so brush up if you need to.

 - We've gone through multiple changes to our Pony Bottles recently. I think we've now found a consistent solution.
 - The presentation shows what the intended setup should look like and how to do that.

- DUST CAPS

As some of you have already noticed, we changed the dust caps on our Regulators.

Because of their design, a little more attention to detail has to be taken into consideration.

These do seal much better than the original ones though.

When you take the reg on and off the shelf, please make sure the retaining ring is wrapped around the lower half of the first stage, before you screw the dust cap On/Off.

This is opposite of what most are used to seeing.

Please also make sure you seat the cap on correctly as these are pretty precise.

Not doing so could:

- Break the thin ring
- Cause the dust cap to fall off during the dive
- Not seal correctly => Flooded regulator when dunked
