Windows

Dry Side

- Cleaned every morning.
- Use clean rag and Brilianize
- Look through window for algae spots
 - Easier to see from dry side than in exhibit

Wet Side

- When diving use doodlebug pad only!
- Suction cups are available to help hold position
- Careful not to scratch acrylic
- Careful not to hit window with your cylinder

Cleaning tools -Windows

Rockwork

- Air compressor can be used for detailed cleaning
- Use only brushes approved by DSO
- Clips are provided on every BCD
- Clip brushes to BCD when not being used
 - > Don't put these in the BCD pockets



Vacuuming

- Lower the vacuum hose into the water
- Plates are stored in the lower cave
- Cover the fibergrate at the bottom of the exhibit with the plates
- Connect the hose to the plate with the butterfly clamp
- Vacuuming is to be done during the first dive of the day
 - > Aesthetics and pump flow

Vacuuming (Continued)







Important Rules

- Anything that goes into the exhibit must come out
- Watch air consumption
- Look up and check on your dive buddies!
- Report any exhibit issues to DSO or husbandry immediately
