



Free Dominion Energy School Programs Field Trip Logistics

Arrival

The Aquarium opens at 9:00 am and closes at 5:00 pm. We ask that you arrive at least 30 minutes before your program start time. This allows time for restroom breaks and group orientation before entering the building. Please tell Jaime what time you will be arriving if it is different than stated in your email.

Parking

Parking for buses is free and conveniently located behind the Aquarium Wharf Parking Garage in the bus lane. For directions go to <https://scaquarium.org/directions-parking> The drop off area for students and chaperones is using the sidewalk next to the bus lane. For the safety of your students, please do not use Concord St. for drop off. Please remind bus drivers to not idle for longer than 5 min (decreases air pollution).

Lunches

Schools may eat lunch outside the Aquarium on Liberty Square. During inclement weather, the Aquarium recommends using the arrival area of the Parking Garage or the covered pavilions in front of the Fort Sumter Museum. Please do not bring your lunches into the Aquarium. We recommend that you leave them on your bus until your lunch time. We do not have a space to store lunches in the Aquarium.

Covid-19

- Please be sure to give Aquarium visitors ample space when in the Aquarium. Ask students not to bump into visitors or crowd them.
- Please do not bring anyone who has been exposed to a positive COVID-19 case within 5 days of your field trip or anyone is exhibiting COVID-19 related symptoms.

Chaperones and Extra Chaperone Payment

For free Dominion Energy School Programs, the Aquarium allows one free *chaperone* per 6 students (please round down), but requires 1 *adult* per 10 students. Certified SC teachers always receive free admission and should not be included in the chaperone count. Chaperone count is for parents, teacher aids or any other non-teacher adults. For example, if you have 60 students in your group, you will receive 10 free chaperones **plus** the teachers with the group. If you want to bring more chaperones than the 1:6 ratio allows, the cost is \$15 each.

Payment arrangements for the extra chaperones must be made in one payment (school check, credit), **one month** before your trip. Parents cannot pay individually at the \$15 group rate. If a parent pays individually the day of the trip, the cost will be \$34.95 each. It's also possible there will be no tickets for the parent to purchase due to timed ticketing. Any credits left on an account after your field trip will be

applied to future trips within 12 months. After 12 months, unused credits will be considered a donation to the Aquarium. Refunds are not available. Please be accurate with your number counts. Your final chaperone number should be given to Jaime Thom at least 1 month before your trip. Please note that our payment policy is to ensure quick entry for groups as well as an easy experience for teachers the day of the trip. Please share this information with all teachers and chaperones in order to make things run smoothly for all. If you have any questions, please call Jaime Thom.

Parent chaperones are not allowed into the classrooms during the classroom program. Instead, parents can enjoy the Aquarium and then meet the group as they exit the classroom. Please make sure to share the program schedule with the chaperones so they know what to expect. Teachers and Teacher Aids are required to be in the classroom program. Teachers/Teacher Aids are responsible for helping with behavior, bathroom breaks and student issues.

Members

Membership privileges do not qualify during a group visit. Communicating this to your chaperones will often prevent unnecessary delays on the day of your visit.

Gift Shop

The Aquarium has a gift shop and students are allowed into the shop in small groups with the supervision of a teacher or chaperone. We will ask the students to place their purchases in the cubbies during their classroom program in order to diminish distractions.

Workshops (School Program Teacher Workshops)

All teachers must attend a 3 hour workshop session when winning a free School Program. During the workshop, teachers learn about the Aquarium's online curriculum and get comfortable with the logistics of their upcoming fieldtrip. Teachers will receive 3 hours credit, which can be used toward continuing education, for attending and will be placed on the "Attended" list for the future (teachers only have to attend once in their teaching career, the first year they win). Failure to complete a workshop will result in the cancellation of your program. If you have questions, contact Jaime Thom.

Fieldtrip Check List

Before your visit:

- Confirm your trip by emailing Jaime Thom (you should have already done this step).
- Fill out the "School Programs Contract" as you are planning your trip and email or fax it back to Jaime Thom no later than 1 month before your trip.
 - On the "School Programs Contract", indicate your number count for students, teachers and chaperones. This is due 1 month before your trip.
 - Arrange payment for extra parent/teacher aid chaperones no later than 1 month before your trip (may not apply).
- Prepare your students by completing the 3 recommended pre-visit activities (more info below under 'Online Curriculum').

- To get the most out of your visit, prepare something for your students when they are not participating in the classroom program. The Aquarium has scavenger hunts and answer keys available online if you would like to print them off before you come (more info below).
- Print bus directions for your travels (see above link under 'Parking').
- Have these phone numbers handy so we can communicate the day of your trip.

During your visit:

- When you arrive, unload in the bus lane next to the garage and walk toward the Aquarium. Guest Services will greet you in front of the Aquarium for a brief orientation before leading you into the building for your classes and self-guided tour.
- The most important thing is to be on time for your classroom program/s. Please pay close attention to when your program/s start. Any question or issue with your designated program time/s please contact Jaime Thom in advance.
- When you are not in the classroom, you are more than welcome to enjoy the Aquarium on your self-guided tour.

After your visit:
